

Mora Mesh Scarf

This simple crochet scarf pattern is perfect if you're looking for something quick to make, beginner friendly, and very wearable.

Made with just 330m of DK weight yarn, this crochet scarf works up fast. The easy lace mesh stitch uses a basic 2 row repeat stitch pattern. Once you've got the rhythm, your hands will just fly.

You can whip this cosy scarf up in just a few hours – perfect for when you want that satisfying feeling of finishing a project in a weekend!

Materials

King Cole Luxury Yak DK – 85% Merino Wool, 15% Yak, 123yds [112m], 50g

- Main color: Peacock (5129) - 3 balls
- 4 mm crochet hook
- Yarn needle

You can use any DK/ light aran weight yarn to achieve a similar effect.

Measurements

Scarf measures 65in [165cm] long and 7.5in [19cm] wide after a light blocking.

Abbreviations

US crochet terms

Beg	beginning
Ch	chain
Sl st	slip stitch
St	stitch
Sc	single crochet
Dc	double crochet
Rep	repeat
Sp	space

Pattern Notes

- Ch 1 at beginning of a row does not count as a stitch.
- Ch 3 at beginning of a row counts as 1 dc.
- The stitch multiple is 4 + 3 extra for the foundation row.
- The scarf can be made longer or shorter by working more or fewer pattern repeats. This will alter the amount of yarn required.
- To make a scarf the same size you will need approx. 330m of DK weight yarn.
- Includes written instructions.
- A stitch count in *italics* is at the end of each row.
- Gauge is not important.

Scarf Instructions

Using Yarn A and 4 mm hook, chain 39

Row 1: 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, and 1 sc in each ch across, turn – 38 sc

Row 2: Ch 1 (does not count as a stitch), 1 sc in first 2 sts, * ch 2, skip 2 sts, 1 sc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, turn – 20 sc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Row 3: Ch 3 (counts as 1 dc here and throughout), 1 dc in next st, * ch 2, skip ch-2 sp, 1 dc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, turn – 20 dc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Row 4: Ch 1, 1 sc in first 2 sts, * ch 2, skip ch-2 sp, 1 sc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, working last sc in top of beg ch-3, turn - 20 sc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Row 5: Ch 3, 1 dc in next st, * ch 2, skip ch-2 sp, 1 dc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, turn - 20 dc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Row 6: Ch 1, 1 sc in first 2 sts, * ch 2, skip ch-2 sp, 1 sc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, working last sc in top of beg ch-3, turn - 20 sc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Row 7: Ch 3, 1 dc in next st, * ch 2, skip ch-2 sp, 1 dc in next 2 sts; rep from * across, turn - 20 dc, 9 x *ch-2 sp*

Rows 8 - 181: Repeat Rows 6 and 7.

Row 182: Repeat Row 6

Row 183: (final row) Ch 1, 1 sc in each st and 2 sc in each ch-2 sp across. Fasten off and weave in threads – 38 sc

Finishing

Gently block your scarf by pinning in shape, spray with water and leave to dry.
